Fitness and Well-being Grant

South Cambridgeshire District Council is urging instructors to apply for up to £300 to lead fitness and wellbeing activities in their communities. Anyone who leads an existing group or who wants to set up a new initiative in the District, such as leading a walking group in their local park or running a weekly yoga class in a village hall, could be eligible for the small grant.

The grant, which is funded by Cambridgeshire County Council, is to help deliver physical activity programmes provided by the District Council in partnership with Living Sport. It is designed to cover costs such as venue hire for up to six weeks, with new participants being entitled to four free sessions. Once the free sessions are complete, participants would be expected to begin paying a small fee to continue participation, meaning that the initiative should become a sustainable source of income for the instructor.

Whaddon's defibrillator - it's at the heart of the village



It's on the side of the Village Hall that faces the Recreation Ground

- If someone is having a suspected heart attack, don't delay, ring either 112 or 999 for the ambulance.
- Dialling 112 is best from a mobile phone, as the operator can track the phone, which directs the ambulance to the patient
- Tell the operator that the community defibrillator is at SG8 5RY and go to the Village Hall. They'll give you the code to unlock the cabinet to remove the defibrillator.
- Take the defibrillator to the place where the person with the suspected heart attack is located.
- The emergency operator will stay on the line to tell you what to do until a paramedic arrives on scene.

HISTORIC WHADDON

Rectory Farmhouse



Rectory Farmhouse is a medieval aisled hall-house built originally to serve at the Rectory, and is believed to date from about 1340; there is a record of the Rectory dated 1359. The hall had cross-wings to both ends and the house originally sat within a moat. A first floor, fireplaces and chimneys were inserted into the double height hall in the 17th century, with tall diagonally set shafts to the stacks. One of the fireplaces is dated 1633. Rectory Farmhouse is now the oldest surviving dwelling in the village and is listed at Grade II*. Within the adjacent farmyard are a granary and barn, both dating from the 18th century and listed at Grade II. The farmhouse also has a brick dovecote, again dating from the 18th century and listed at Grade II.

George VI

'The inclemency of the weather did not materially dampen the ardour of the inhabitants of Whaddon who under a hardworking Committee, arranged and carried through a long-to-be remembered Coronation programme of events.

The day began with a church service and was followed by the fancy dress parade organised by Mrs Hale and Mrs W T England. The successful parade produced much merriment with original and comical costumes.

Although the sun shone briefly the sports events, due to take place on Mr J Coningsby's



meadow, had to be cancelled due to the weather.

After the meal a toast to the King and Queen was proposed by Mr W Parcell (Chairman of the Committee) and each child was presented with a Coronation souvenir beaker. There was much interest in the King's speech which was played using a wireless lent by Mr H Bishop.

The musical evening arranged by Mrs Hale, Mr R Jarman and Mr H T Hinkins was '....much enjoyed, each item being received with much applause. Special mention should be made of the rendering of the Whitsuntide song by Messrs J and A Smith. (see arrows above) They were bedecked with ribbons and branches of oak and it gave younger inhabitants the opportunity to hear this old song'

After midnight Mr Parcell praised the hard-working committee supported by hearty cheers and the evening finished with the singing of Auld Lang Syne and the National Anthem.

TIMES PAST Royal Celebrations (2)

This edition continues the history of Royal Celebrations in Whaddon using previous research by Stan and Jean Ralls and articles from the Royston Crow. Actual extracts from the *Royston Crow* appear in italics.

George V

Coronation 22nd June 1911



Whaddon celebrated the Coronation of King George V with a service in the Church at 11o'clock and at 1o'clock a dinner was provided in Mr Coningsby's barn. After dinner each child under 14 was presented with a Coronation mug. Tea was served in a large marquee. Sports were followed by a large bonfire and dancing. 'The inhabitants were well entertained and spent a thoroughly enjoyable day'.

Silver Jubilee 6th May 1935

During the morning a Thanksgiving Service was held in the Church which was well attended. A cricket match, Married v Singles, took place at 2.30pm, singles being the winners. Children's Sports were organised by the Juvenile Sports Committee followed by tea for the children in the Church Room. Mugs were presented and photographs taken.

The big event of the day was 'a meat tea for all the adults in the schoolroom. This had been transformed for the occasion, and tables resembled those of a banqueting hall. Justice was done to the bounteous fare provided, and a toast to H.M. King George and Queen Mary was proposed'.



In the evening adult sports, tug-of-war (singles winning) and a wheelbarrow race took place. Further refreshments were served in the schoolroom followed by a social and singing. Just before midnight everyone joined hands and sang Auld Lang Syne before Mr W T England jnr. proposed a vote of thanks to all who had worked so hard. The singing of the National Anthem brought the evening to a close.

Thoughts for the Summer

16 From now on, therefore, we regard no one from a human point of view; [a] even though we once knew Christ from a human point of view, [b] we know him no longer in that way. 17 So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! 1 Corinthians 5:16-17

There is a sense in which becoming the new vicar of a place which is a rural setting with a very old church like Whaddon, you enter into

an ancient tradition and forms of worship practiced for many generations year on year. You are through the oral traditions and customs from pagan rites adopted by the church - for God is both in and beyond all - affirming that all life comes from God both old and new.

As we enter again into that time just before the outpouring of Pentecost the anticipation that Christ will be doing new things, making the 'old rites' a 'new creation' can be seen in the Morris dance of the Whitsuntide on the green and the old song re-sung, a living reminder of old traditions with the faith that beyond all God is the creator and redeemer, making all things new. It embodies the life, joy and love that is found in all creation.

I, as a new creation in Christ, will be bringing I hope my own unique gifts to Whaddon to be used and enjoyed by the village. As well as discovering what those who live here enjoy and want to share. Understanding and learning some of the old traditions of this lovely ancient place as well as starting some good new traditions is something I hope we can do in the future years here together.

So I hope as the year continues and Covid restrictions fade, as spring and summer flourish, we may celebrate the past and also bring in some ideas that can bring both deep flourishing and life to the community and to each of you in your unique way.

As many of you know in my previous life I was a professional singer, so we are planning to use the church for some fun concerts and social events leading up to Christmas. A jazz night and perhaps a Taize service where those who would like to join a little choir and have a bit of fun socially can come along. If you're interested in getting involved with either event, do let Karen or David our church wardens know or the wonderful Helen and Peter - Whaddon's own very talented musicians and musical leaders. If you've never got involved before don't let that put you off. ALL things are made new, that means everything, there's nothing that you need to worry about looking back on with are thinking of new things we can do now to create community and nourish personal flourishing.

Looking forward to my first ride on a steam tractor at the Church Fete - a very tangible way of bringing both old and new together at the same time! I encourage you to think of ways you'd like to be involved and know that anything however small is appreciated and encouraged.

St Mary's Whaddon; Report to Annual Parochial Church Meeting

The Annual Parochial Church Meeting was held at St Mary's after the service on Sunday 8th May, and at that meeting the Annual Report for 2021 was presented. A copy of the full report and accounts is displayed on the noticeboard at the back of the church and on the church pages of the Whaddon Website. Highlights from the report include:

- Responding to the Covid pandemic, with on-line services in the first part of the year and adapting services to accommodate social distancing once we were able to resume worship in the church.
- Re-roofing the church following the theft of lead. Contractors started on site in February and the work was completed by May. This included additional work to repair rot in timbers over the nave discovered during the course of the work.
- Appointment of our new Vicar. The Rev Helen Orr took up her appointment as vicar of the joint benefice of Whaddon and Bassingbourn in October, and is actively working to get to know her parishioners.

The PCC is grateful for all the support it receives from the wider community in Whaddon, including the financial support in helping to cover the cost of re-roofing the church. This work is now complete and fully paid for, with no outstanding debt.

Annual Parish Meeting



Whaddon Parish Council Matters

Parish Council elections

The six current Parish Councillors, Lee Ginger, Jo Hart, Will Elbourn, Anita Birch, Nigel Strudwick and Deb Townshend, were all re-elected unopposed in May. There is, however, a vacancy for one further Councillor, for which there were no nominations. The PC will be advertising for a new councillor soon. If you are interested, speak to one of us or the clerk to find out more details.

Also in May, our two South Cambs. District Councillors, Sally Ann Hart and Jose Hales were re-elected to continue represent Whaddon, Melbourn and Meldreth.

PC Annual General Meeting

This was held as part of the May meeting. Lee Ginger was re-elected Chair for the year and Nigel Strudwick elected Vice Chair. The Planning Committee now consists of Will Elbourn and Anita Birch and Anita also continues as one of the PC representatives on the Village Hall Trust. As mentioned above, we shall recruit another Parish Councillor to bring our strength up to seven and we shall also co-opt a villager for the Planning Committee.

Whaddon Parish Plan

The plan team continue to work hard to devise the village-wide questionnaire which they hope to have ready by the time of the July Church Fete.

Whaddon Gap road safety scheme

We are very frustrated that work on this important safety scheme has yet to begin although the County Council have started the statutory speed reduction consultation on the A1198 from 50 to 40 mph. While this work is funded and will definitely go ahead, we are still waiting for the original entrance to the new houses opposite Whaddon Gap to be closed permanently and the new entrance opened up before work can begin on the scheme. As we noted in the last Whaddon News, closure of the original entrance is one of the Planning Conditions imposed upon the developer when permission was granted to build the new houses on the site.

Speedwatch co-ordinator appointed

The Parish Council are delighted to announce that following our appeal, we have a new Speedwatch co-ordinator, Phil Neale of Bridge Street. Phil has been part of the Speedwatch team before and is keen to get up and running as soon as possible.

Whaddon 'difficult items' recycling facility is OPEN!!

I am delighted to tell you all that the facility for collecting certain not easily recycled items is now operational and ready to receive your **USED** medicine blister packs and crisp packets!

You will find two brown bins on the Recreation Ground side of the Village Hall. Here is a link to a photo of them:

They are clearly labelled as to which is which.

Medicine blister packs and crisp packets cannot be recycled via either the domestic waste collection or the public recycling centres -- they go to landfill. I and two volunteers will be emptying these new bins regularly and one of us will take the contents periodically to collection points. I hope that, as things develop, we may be able to recycle additional items.

It is ESSENTIAL that nothing else other than what is on the signs is put in the bins. Remember these are being emptied by your fellow villagers and they do not want any unpleasant surprises; there are other bins adjacent to the hall for other waste.

I am very grateful to the Parish Council for supporting this project from the start. We have received a lot of help and advice from South Cambridgeshire District Council, and I am particularly grateful to them for the bins, and to Jose Hales, our District Councillor, for his help in actually getting the bins to Whaddon. I also thank my two volunteers (Clare Hales and Paul Evans) for being willing to spare their time, and also Rachel Harrison of Foxton for her time showing me the sort of things that her village are doing and giving me a lot of inspiration.
